**Summative ELPAC Update** – presented by Rosina Kirkland currently the number of English learner student needing to take the ELPAC Summative is 7,190 A of January 15, 2023 in the area of ELPAC Summative, ELPAC Initial, Alternate ELPAC. Which will consist of the following domains – Listening, Speaking, Oral and Writing. TK-2 will be assisted by staff and Grades 3-12 independently but supervised. **English Learner Data Dive** – **p**resented by Timothy Tibbs We have had 4.5 percent increase of English learners enroll in the district since the 2021-2022 school year. This year we have already reclassified more than last year, but still have 7,190 EL students, many of which are newcomers (1,134 came in to the district in the last two years). The following slides will show some of these data point the three-year English Learner enrollment increase of 4.52% in enrollment from 2020-21. Take a look at the comparison of 3 Year English Learner Enrollment in the following grade levels /sites for English Learner, At-risk of LTEL, and Long-term English Learner for Elementary, Middle and High School. Student Reclassification update:

- **Reclassification update** At this time, there have been 2 rounds of reclassification that has reclassified 340 students and Round 3 will be released once High School Semester 1 Grades have been entered
- **RFEP Monitoring Reclassified Students** are monitored for four years after being reclassified. Currently: 1st year of monitoring: 399 (2021-2022) | 2nd year of monitoring: 126 (2020-2021) | 3rd year of monitoring: 254 (2019-2020) | 4th year of monitoring: 591 (2018-2019).

**ELPAC Data Dive – 2021-22** presented by Rosina Kirkland - Summative ELAP Pie Chart presented Level at 28.2% | Level 2 – 32.2% | Level 3 – 30.8% | Level 4 – 7% and No score – 1.6%. Chart with ELPAC Overall proficiency Levels by grade span.

**English Learner Attendance Rates** – Over all current rate is 90.4% and current EL attendance rate is 91.8%. English Only rate is 89.9% graduation in 2020-21 overall rate is 85.2% and EL graduation rate was 71.7%. 2021-22 88.1% Overall graduation rate and EL graduation rate 82.4% total 318.
